The nearly four million dollar **Greater Lima Region Amphitheater and Park** was officially opened Monday, July 31 and was followed by a week-long party and celebration with musical acts and events through the first weekend in August. The Amphitheater is located at 128 E Spring St, Lima.

The project started as an idea in 2017 and grew into a future destination for arts and events in Lima's downtown area. The funding came from a variety of sources including the Lima Rotary Club, the State of Ohio, the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, and the City of Lima.

Tracie Sanchez from Lima Rotary said it best: "If it wasn't for the State of Ohio and the City of Lima and all of our donors and sponsors that have put forth the effort, and especially the Rotary and all that Rotary has done to raise the money, something like this could never have happened..."
